And that you know there is room for all of it, inside of you, and in our community. If your mouth is filled with laughter - may you laugh fully. If you are weeping, may the seeds of your tears plant for a harvest of joy.

FUNDRAISER**

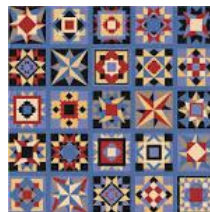
On Wednesday March 25<sup>th</sup> from 4:30-6:30pm

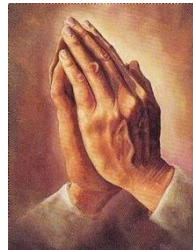
