HIGHLIGHTS

***Endowment:** Distributions were approved (distributions are listed on page 2) with a new motion that was approved to recommend that \$9,600 be put in the non-designated Building Fund.

***Youth Ministry:** 2026 Mission Trip deposit will be made soon. Sign-ups will take place for a mentorship program. There are 16 kids in Confirmation currently.

***Men's Club:** Meatball dinner will be Oct. 19.

***Personnel:** Employee reviews will be carried out in November.

***Property & Grounds:** Deadbolts installation, a leaky faucet in the kitchen, loose plexiglass above the front entrance door and an event sign were all discussed.

***Worship:** A greeter meeting will be held Nov. 2 to talk about the role they will have.

***Membership, Life & Growth:** New member gathering will be on Nov. 9. A Retro Dinner meeting will be on Nov. 16. The Dinner will be on March 8.

***Mission and Vision:** What Bible story tells our story at CVLC? Council members shared the Bible story that they felt was the best comparison for the current time. More discussion will be at the next meeting. This will lead to working on a vision for CVLC.

2025 ENDOWMENT DISTRIBUTION

The Endowment Committee made a recommendation for the distribution from the Endowment Fund. Our Church Council approved this distribution at the October meeting. We have \$24,000 available to use for a distribution from the interest. The committee is recommending we take a distribution of \$24,000 from the Endowment fund and it be distributed the following ways:

- **40% for Capital Improvements**
- Debt reduction via deposit into the Building Fund **\$9,600**
- **20% for Ministry of the ELCA**
- **\$4,800** to Bethel Butikk
- **40% for Community Outreach/Youth**
- **\$4,800** to Sugar Creek Bible Camp
- **\$4,800** to Westby School District Delinquent Lunch Accounts
